PRODUCE. Chicago, July 3.-Clear weather in the harvest belt had a weakening effect at the opening of the wheat market today, initial quotations showing losses of a shade to %. Later a little firmer tone developed on covering by shorts. July which opened at 1.5, sold off to 1.14% and then advanced to 1.15%. An advance of 1 cent in the July de-livery was the feature of early trading in the corn market. Much of the demand was based on liberal sales of cash corn for eastern shipment. The strength of the July option caused a firm tone in the more deferred futures. The opening on July was unchanged to ½ higher, at 69% to 69½. Dats were rather weak at the start ow-ing to favorable crop prospects, but ral-lied considerably early in the day with the bulge in corn. July opened ½ low-er at 8 and advanced to 48½. Provisions were firm on brisk demand for land and ribs by a local backer. A lo-cent advance in live hogs was a buil-ish factor. Prices at the start were 5 to 1½c. -higher.
