I set the time for the baptism the next day at 2 o'clock, and at the appointed time the people had gathered a large congregation on the banks of a beautilul oreck under the shade of the large oak trees. I thought it too good a chance to let pass, so I called them to order and talked to them for one hour. Perfect order prevailed; during the their hats off. At the close many of the people invited me to their houses said there would be more to hapand tize in the near futute.

I was compelled to leave them the next morning to meet Elder Caufield at Owensburo, 250 miles east of here, and proceed on our way to attend our conference that was held at Haweville on the 14th and 15th of September On our way we held meetings with full houses. At conference Elder Kimhall appuinted Elder L. B. Pace and myself to visit the Saints in Han cock, Daviers and Onto counties and do what good we could.

We left Hawaville the evening of the 17th of Beptember and Walked three miles, where we spent two days holding two meetings, the people taking great interest but not baving the mural courage to embrace such an unpopular doctrine. We hade them farewell and proceeded on our way to Daviers county, where we held one meeting, baptized four good, honset souls, and greater.

spent a few days with them, feeding President Geo. Q. Cannon felt to atthem the bread of life. In feture they tend this conference without being president of the Stake, said he had

treated us to the fat of the land and we enjoyed our stay with them very much.

Leaving them in tears we started on or way to Ohlo county, thirty-five miles away, taking the same convey-ance we had been in the nabit of riding on before. We arrived at the nouse of Brother Aaron Jewels September 27, and found the Saints in that locality enjoying the spirit of the Gospel and trying to live the lives of Sints. During our stay there we belo etabt meetings, baptized nine good houest souls and blessed five children, organized a branch known as the West erfield branch, with twenty-four memuers, and ordained Brother Geo, Jewel a Priest to preside over them. instructed them in their duties and taught them the Word of Wisdom and the benefit they would receive in living strictly virtuous liver.

We left Ohio county on the 10th of October, Brothers Barney Miller and George Russell furnishing a conveyance to take us to Owenaboro, distant, where we spent the night with Brother Job Bailess. We left Owensready to turn our guns loose In Callo-

way county again.
