



THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART AS IT WILL LOOK WHEN COMPLETED.




The picture shows how the New York Museum of Art will look when the two new wings facing Fifth avenue are completed. The plans have been turned over to the department of buildings, and since the money to finish the extension is now in the hands of the trustees it is promised that the work will be put under way immediately and that it will be ready for use in 1908. The addition will provide a great lecture hall in which the new head of the museum, Sir Purdon Clarke, will deliver a series of discourses on art subjects. When the structure is completed it will be one of the largest in point of space for exhibits in the world.

AMERICAN EDITION OF AN ENGLISH LOVE MAZE.



The old time garden device herewith represented has recently been constructed on the estate of Miss Cornelia Warren at Waltham, Mass. It is modeled after the famous maze at Hampton Court, England, which is reputed to have been designed by King Henry as a tower for the fair Rosamond. It is a labyrinthine walk of armor clad hedges about six feet in height set so close together that only one person at a time can pass between them. The paths are so devious and so confusing that few succeed in reaching the center and finding the point of exit. The tower is for those who wish to witness the confused efforts of the persons who have entered the mysterious pathway.




Charles F. Ritchel's Flying Machine.

RITCHEL IN HIS FAMOUS AIR SHIP.

A new rival to Santos Dumont and Roy Knabenshue has sprung up in Bridgeport, Conn. In the person of Charles F. Ritchel, inventor of devices of every imaginable sort, the most famous of which is his air ship. This flying machine was exhibited in New York in 1878, and was lauded by the papers throughout the country at the time. The airship was confiscated by a sheriff at Manhattan Beach in 1882, but its inventor did not worry, as his plans were safe in his workshop at Bridgeport. Mr. Ritchel will build another air ship on the original plans very soon.

"Twenty-seven years ago a flying machine built by me in Bridgeport, Conn., performed feats that have never before nor since been equaled," said the inventor. "My machine for four years appeared in different cities throughout the East exhibiting with circuses and at public gatherings. It never failed me. It traveled hundreds of miles all told, and it never caused me the slightest apprehension."

A guerilla war is being waged by the teamsters of New York against their employers. Profiting by the experience of their Chicago brethren, when 100,000 drivers were out of employment five months, losing one million dollars, the New York teamsters decided against a general strike.


The guerilla style of striking will be more annoying than a general strike, as the employers will be constantly harassed, and will mean the employment of strike breakers at a considerable expense to the employers.

The teamsters say that the employers will not be able to stand the loss of profits and will surrender by signing the agreement for recognition of the union and 25 cents for overtime.

The strikers look the men who have taken their places and place all manner of obstructions in their way. Almost every driver in the city is a member of the International Association of Teamsters.
