


RITCHEL IN HIS FAMOUS AIR SHIP.

A new rival to Santos Dumont and Roy Knabenshut has sprung up in Bridgeport, Conn., in the person of Charles F. Ritchel, inventor of devices of every imaginable sort, the most famous of which is his air ship. This flying muchine was exhibited in New York in 1878, and was lauded by the papers throughout the country at the time. The airship was confiscated by a sheriff at Manhattan Beach in 1882, but its inventor did not worry, as his plans were safe in his workshop at Bridgeport. Mr. Ritchel will build another air ship on the original plans very soon.


"Twenty-seven years ago a flying machine built by me in Bridgeport, Conn., performed feats that have never before nor since been equalled," said the inventor. "My machine for four years appeared in different cities throughout the East exhibiting with circuses and at public gatherings. It never failed me. It traveled hundreds of miles all told, and it never caused me the slightest apprehension."

THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART AS IT WILL LOOK WHEN COMPLETED.




The picture shows how the New York Museum of Art will look when the two new wings facing Flifth avenue are completed. The plans have been turned over to the department of buildings, and since the money to finish the extension is now in the hands of the trustees it is promised that the work will be put under way immediately and that it will be ready for use in 1908. The addition will provide a great lecture hall in which the new head of the museum, Sir Purdon Clarke, will deliver a series of discourses on art subjects. When the structure is completed it will be one of the largest in point of space for exhibits in the world.

The old time garden device herewith represented has recently been constructed on the estate of Alice Cornelia Warren at Waltham, Mass. It is modeles after the famous maze at Hampton Court.
