BOSTON REPORT CREATES INTEREST

Big Garfield Concentrator Is Making An Excellent Account of Itself.

GOOD EXTRACTION RECORD

Engineer Impressed With Work Being Done—High Tribute Paid Manager Bettles.

"That statement printed in the 'News' of yesterday," said a well known mining engineer today, "has interested me very much—particularly that portion of it which refers to the results accomplished at the Garfield concentrator during the months of May, June and July. I recall that before the construction of the plant began, Mill Manager Bettles promised to make an extraction of 68 per cent on the Bingham porphyry ore when the mill was completed. Only four sections have been in operation, but he has made good; for I note that the extraction for the months stated ran from 65.5 to 70 per cent. I also happen to know that the extraction so far this month has been very much better—that it has averaged 71 per cent, and may exceed as high as 72 per cent.

"I visited Garfield one day this week and found that more units of the mill are practically ready to go into commission, and was told that they would all be in operation by the middle of September or the first of October, when Mine Manager Cates will be ready to supply the tonnage. Boston Consolidated has had its troubles during the past year, but I with now and I do not doubt that officials will be in position to give out some interesting figures bearing on the cost of mining and milling before very long at the mine end, things are shaping up splendidly and they certainly could not be better at Garfield.

"Mine Manager Cates, I am informed, is sending out a better grade of ore than was the case a few months ago. It averages about 1.7 per cent copper; the mill is treating in the four units between 800 and 900 tons of ore per day, and is making a concentrate product averaging from 20 to 22 per cent. I am of the opinion that the milling costs for August will not go much above 60 cents a ton. Later, as the other units are placed in commission, this will be gradually reduced. I believe Mill Manager Bettles expects to bring it down as low as 25 cents a ton, or thereabouts, by running the fact that there are no elevators to maintain; that from the time the ore leaves the crushers it is taken in a like manner to the concentrate bins. That is the secret of the success of the Boston Consolidated mill. Mr. Bettles is a master builder in the art of mill construction. He brought from Arizona, where he recently made a thorough study of the workings of the Boston Garfield plant and was so impressed with its simplicity that he has ordered the construction of the mill at Garfield where a system of tests will be made before beginning the building of a larger and permanent one.

ON MINING EXCHANGE.

Sluggish Market But Prices Remain Fairly Steady.

Although the market for mining stocks was sluggish today, prices remained fairly steady. In what trading there was done, the Tintic list as usual figured conspicuously. FEWER CARS FOR ORE SERVICE

The Railroads Say Equipment Is Needed for Coal and Beet Traffic.

MINE OPERATORS NOTIFIED

Allowance of Utah Consolidated Cut Down One-Third—Same Old Story.

From now on until the sugar beet harvest is over, the metalliferous mines of the state will have to get along with less railroad equipment to move ore to the mills and smelters. Notice to this effect has been received by the leading producers of Bingham and Tintic.

The railroads say that the beet raisers must be accommodated even if it does work a hardship on the ore producer. Besides, beets constitute a perishable commodity, whereas ore does not.

Aside from the beet culturists, the coal camps are demanding more cars than during the summer months. People feel the approach of cool weather and are looking in their winter's supply of fuel.

Manager Risque of the Utah Consolidated in reply to a query today stated that he had received notice that the car allowance to his company had been cut down one-third. Since shipments began, to the Garfield smelter there have been 150 cars in Utah Consolidated service and it simply means that the tonnage must be handled with 100 cars. If there is a prompt unloading of cars after reaching Garfield it is likely that the big Bingham company will manage to get out the usual tonnage and milling because the company has had a lot of trouble lately. The smelter yard is congested with ore, the sampling mill is overworked and the furnace capacity of the plant is yet inadequate to meet the demands of the producer.

ELY COPPER NEWS.

Copper Flat Produced 20,000 Tons of Ore Last Week.

Advices from Ely are to the effect that the shipments from the Copper Flat mines which include the Nevada Consolidated and Cumberland Ely mines—last week were the heaviest since the blowing in of the Steptoe smelter. The output was nearly 20,000 tons.

THE SPHINX MILL.

Round Mountain Plant Is Out of Commission Temporarily.

The Sphinx mill at Round Mountain, Nevada, in which W. H. Clark of this city is largely interested, has been closed temporarily until an adjustment of water rates can be effected. The company buys its water supply and complains that it has been charged an exorbitant figure for the service. The clean-up from the plant in July was \$11,000.
