Terrible Affair as the Result of an Explosion of Benzine.

DAMAGES AGAINST A RAILROAD.

An Aged Pinto Indian Chief Visits California.—An Enterprising Young Farmer at Work.

At seven o'clock on Sunday morning, while a freight train was passing through a tunnel between Hamerock and Fossil, a serious accident occurred. About forty tons of debris were fallen, caused by an explosion. All the cars were destroyed. No injuries.

Railroad Director has taken his life at Astoria, Oreg., by cutting her throat with a revolver, her heart at the death bed. He brought the sample to town this morning and it is now on exhibition at Nuttall & Edwards drug store. The fragment weighs five pounds, is of a bluish brown color, and has the surface, and is not explosive. Expert observers say the mass is mostly composed of iron, although he has as yet made no regular assay. They say there is no doubt of its being of meteoric origin, and will at once test it to see if it is the composition of the meteorite to determine.
