## NEWS OF THE WEST.

**A Town Which Insists Its Street Sprinkling Shall be Done at Night.**

**FISHERMEN FIND A WATERY GRAVE**

Mixing California Grapes and Nebraska Corn Juice—Killed by Drunken White Orchestrated.

The Pelicans, California, city trustees have decided that the pelicans of Pelicans must wear uniforms to be bought at their own expense.

As a result of a drunken brawl Tuesday afternoon, David Romero was fatally stabbed by Joaquin Alvarado in the abdomen. Alvarado was arrested while attempting to flee.

J. H. P. Littlejohn and H. D. Hahn were accidentally drowned at Paradise Cut near San Francisco, Tuesday. The men were fishing for shad in a boat, but drifted into the falls and capsized. Their bodies have not been recovered.

A young man named Low Hobbs, a comrade with the Pacific Electric company, who became overdrunk while on the road from San Rafael to Pasadena, California, Tuesday, drank freely of cold water and was taken sick on arrival, and died next morning.

S. P. Simpson, a retired banker at Eagle Pass, Texas, and a former deputy at Los Angeles, Cal., Tuesday morning, which resulted in his death in a few hours. Mr. Simpson was about 40 years of age and a prominent member of the Grand Army of the Republic.

F. M. Arthur, chief of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, in his western tour, and was in Elko, Idaho, on Wednesday evening. He will be in Evanston this Thursday evening, in Ogden Friday evening, and in Salt Lake City on Saturday. He will then proceed eastward over the Rio Grande Western, holding meetings with the engineers at each stopping place.

An old book dealer named Henry Arnold made a desperate attempt to end his life in Oakland, Cal., on Tuesday afternoon, by springing into the bay. A boatman named James Smith was too quick for the old man, and leaped to the rescue a moment after the splash was heard. Smith saved Arnold's life after a brief struggle. He found it difficult to draw his victim to the dock, as Arnold struggled to be released.

During a thunder storm at Walla Walla, Wash., Monday, Claude Chidley, 17 years old, returning from school, was struck by lightning while climbing a fence, knocked senseless and seriously injured, his body being hurled in air, and he died by a lightning bolt. A peculiar freak of the electric fluid was that it wrapped the victim around the boy's neck in such a way as to choke him, and it had to be cut to save his life. The boy was found, apparently lifeless, partly paralyzed, with his clothes on fire and blood oozing from his mouth, nose and ears. His condition is precarious.

Sanita Clara county, Cal., has determined to put its prisoners in sprinkling roads. The board of supervisors has decided to sprinkle the public highways at night. The first of June, all the watered roads will receive their shower after sundown. It has been found that during the summer season the water which is put on during the day evaporates rapidly. In fact, when a sprinkling cart goes over a road between the hours of 10 a. m. and 4 p. m. there is scarcely a trace of the water on a hot day. It is argued that if the sprinkling is done after sundown, and while the ground has cooled, the dust will absorb the water and the effects will be seen the next day in roads without dust.

Members of the G. A. R. in northern Wyoming and southern Montana are arranging for an interstate memorial day service upon the Custer battle ground, which is a few miles from the Wyoming-Montana boundary line. The Custer battle anniversary has been made a national ceremony and the remains of over 1,200 soldiers, most of whom lost their lives in the various Indian wars of the West are buried there. The United States troops at Fort Custer, the government employees at the cemetery and at the Custer reservation will take part in the ceremonies. Ex-Congressman Mondell has been asked to deliver the memorial oration. An effort will be made to have the memorial services repeated upon each Decoration day hereafter.

Cheyenne, Wyoming, Tribune: The world west exhibition at the fair grounds Sunday afternoon ended disastrously and perhaps fatally. A small crowd attended owing to a general drizzle and south wind and rainy weather. The exhibition had hardly commenced when several riders were thrown violently to the ground. Some escaped with bruised limbs, faces, etc., while others were quite badly stove up. L. W. Hazel, one of the cowboy riders, couched a vicious blow on his immediately began to groan. He was picked up in an unconscious condition and carried away, being taken to the county hospital. It was thought at first that he would die, but he was getting away last evening and will recover.

The San Francisco Chronicle complains that a wholesale attempt to injure the reputation of California brandy by sending abroad a large amount of cheap and inferior goods as pure grape brandy has been detected by Collector of Port Wine. The manager of the San Francisco brandy manufacturing establishment, Blackman street, are the persons accused. The investigation disclosed the fact, it is stated, that the warehouse people had taken fifteen barrels of genuine California grape brandy and eighty-five barrels of low spirituous alcohol out from Oregon and had mixed them together. In this mixture of 4,000 or 4,200 gallons were to be added enough water to increase the mixture to 7,000 or 8,000 gallons. This was to be sent East and to London, Ireland, France, California, (Grange) Italy, etc. The warehouse people were caught. It is declared, however, that they sent out any of the concoction, and although they are under the regulations of the custom-house they have not, as

far as known, committed any act that will make them liable to legal punishment.
