LOCAL BRIEFS.

Ohioans Meet Friday—The Ohio society will meet tomorrow evening at the Commercial club to discuss the proposed outing of the society on the seventh inst.

Formal Transfer Made—The formal transfer of "The Stockade" from the Citizens' Investment company to Herman J. Mundt was recorded yesterday afternoon for \$130,000.

Arthur Moreton Graduated—Arthur A. Moreton, son of City Recorder J. B. Moreton, was graduated from Yale law school Wednesday last, with the degree of LL. B. Mr. Moreton returns home next week to practice his profession in this city.

Busy Licensing—E. H. Callender, a United States internal revenue collector, and his deputies are busy engaged renewing liquor licenses which expired June 30. Applications for renewal are coming in all over the state.

State Veterinarian Busy—State Veterinarian A. C. Young has mailed to Utah cattle and sheep men copies of the state laws applying to their calling, so that if they do not live up to them they need not be surprised to see Dr. Young camping on their land.

Summer School Outing—A big outing to the Laegon is being planned by those in charge of the University summer school, to take place July 9. Professor E. W. Rymond, who has the matter in charge, says it will be a restful half holiday as the teachers at the summer school have had a strenuous time this year, and prefer to spend a quiet afternoon at the resort.

Wants Deputy Surveyor—The government needs a deputy surveyor in the customs service at San Francisco at a salary of \$900 per annum. The examination for this position will be held in Salt Lake on July 14, and any citizen of the United States may enter it. The age limit is 55, excepting in the case of honorably discharged United States soldiers, who are otherwise duly qualified.

Simpson Winked too Often—William Simpson of this city is in trouble at Pocatello. According to the Tribune of that burg, Simpson, put in his spare time trailing two young women about the streets, winking at them and strongly intimating that he was particularly desirous of cultivating their acquaintance. Simpson did not deny the soft impeachment, when arrested on complaint of the mothers of the girls, and was promptly fined \$10.

Increase in Fees—Secretary of State Charles S. Tingey reported yesterday that for the second quarter ending June 30 the fees in his office amounted to \$29,088.34. This is about three times as great as the fees for the corresponding quarter of last year. He explains this increase on account of the improved business conditions. While he lost the fees of the insurance commission under the new law he gained the fees from the issuing of automobile licenses.

PLANS FOR DECORATION FOR ENCAMPMENT WEEK

Specifications Ready for Bidders in Commercial Club Building—Need More Accommodations.

The executive committee of the G. A. R. encampment has decided upon plans for decorations of the city, and has sent out the following notice relative to receiving bids for electrical display.

Plans and specifications for electrical decoration for the forty-third national encampment of the G. A. R., to be held Aug. 4 to 14, are now on file in the office of the executive director, 232 Commercial club building. Electricians who desire to make bids will please call at this office, where they will find everything necessary for purposes of making bids on this work. The executive committee reserves the right to reject any and all bids. The bids will be opened in the executive offices on July 7 at noon.

The Women's Citizens' committee again calls attention to the necessity for householders opening their homes to the visitors who are expected here during the G. A. R. encampment. Up to the present time it is said, the response to the Women's Citizens' committee, which has the matter in charge, has been excellent and accommodations have been provided for about 15,000 people.

It will be necessary to provide sleeping places for fully 20,000. It is said, and most of these must be accommodated in the homes of the city. Anyone who can accommodate any of the visitors is urged to send his name to the committee, when details regarding the entertainment will be furnished.

Notice has been received at the executive office of the G. A. R. encampment in the Commercial club building, that the Grand Army men of Kansas intend to be present at the encampment in full force. Commander Rickel, of the detachment of Kansas, states that there will be a special train and a large representation of veterans from all parts of the state. The party will be accompanied by two bands, which will furnish music for the parade and for concert purposes during the encampment. The famous Modoc club, a male chorus, will also accompany the party.
