

## THE BRIBERY CASES.

**DAVIS DON'T KNOW HOW MUCH MONEY HE HAS GOT FROM THE COUNTY.**

**EMPLOYED FOR NEARLY A YEAR.**

**He May Have Received \$500, Perhaps \$1,000, and Possibly \$1,500, But He Is Not Sure.**

The bribery case against ex-County Treasurer Hamburger and Davis, held its right-way in Judge Hiles' court again today. In C. Davis, the main witness for the prosecution, was on the stand the whole of the morning and was subjected to a very rigid cross examination. He proved to be a very unpredictable witness for the county. His memory was a gigantic institution of forgetfulness on many matters. He admitted having been in the employ of the county last May last, but has no idea how much he has been paid for his services, which he says have been largely gratuitous. The amounts received have been divided into fifteen twenty-dollar sums, and may aggregate \$500 or \$1,000.

**BILLS ON THE BOARD.**

The case of ex-Delegates Hamburger and Morris came up for hearing in Judge Hiles' department of the Third district court yesterday afternoon. The defendants are charged with bribery. It is alleged that while they held the office of delegates for this county they were in position to purchase certain iron to be used in the construction of the joint city and county building and asked from L. C. Davis, Winsor Britton's agent a bribe, to which A large sum of money with the understanding that their votes, opinions and actions would be influenced in making the contract should be forthcoming by Winsor Britton's company.

Mr. Davis was called to the stand by the prosecution and stated that he came to the Britton office to try to sell him the bill, which he was employed for the joint building.

He met Hamburger and Morris soon after, and the former said that he was not ready to seal the contract, but thought it could be made for \$10,000, that it would cost between \$12,000 and \$20,000, and Hamburger then wanted to know if there was ten percent of the contract price to be had.

The defense was then examined by Mr. Rawlins. He stated that he came to Salt Lake July 2 last, 1895, and registered at the Knickerbocker, where he remained during the entire time he was here.

"Did you?" he was asked, "pay damages with Britton, the original contractor for the joint building?"

"I came here with the object of seeing him without being seen."

"Do you know whom had it in the contract to do what you work?"

"No, but found that he had given it up before I got here."

"What did you meet Morris?"

"At the Knickerbocker, where I met Hamburger."

"When were you first employed by Mr. Whittemore?"

"I don't know who sent me to get my services for him."

"Where was it?"

"At the Union League club, Chicago."

"How often did he give you money?"

"About twenty times."

"Are you prepared to say that he did not give you \$500 at one time?"

"I am."

"What does Mr. Britton tell Mr. Whittemore?"

"He told me first that he had read some of the letters I had written to the firm about it."

At intermission adjourned; it was taken until the morning of to-day.
