The Insane Asylum.—The Enquirer says that the 40 acres of land near Provo City, which has been selected as the site for the Territorial Insane Asylum, has been surveyed by County Surveyor Stark and Directors Dusenberry and Dunn. Title to the land has also been secured to the Territory, so that it will not be long before the work of construction begins. Provo City and Utah County together pay for this location and present it to the Territory for the purpose of a site for the Asylum. The cost of the land was \$2,500. Tullidge's Quarterly.—The April number of Tullidge's Quarterly Magazine is at length from the press, having been unavoidably delayed while waiting for the fine engravings with which its pages are embellished. It is a very creditable issue. Its main article is "Utah's Commerce and Cooperation," which occupies the first half of the magazine and is splendidly illustrated with steel plates and wood cuts. Mr. Fox, surveyor, proceeded this morning to the location, to run over the line and connect it. An impression has gone out to the effect that the Utah Eastern Co. has sold out to the Denver & Rio Grande Company. This is an error. An agreement has been entered into with the Denver & Rio Grande Company for the latter to make the third quarter mile with Salt Lake by building a road to that point from Park City, thus making a through line from the Coalville mines. The latter road is now being built. The Utah Eastern Company is as intact as ever."
