HE VETOED THE BILL.

Governor Wells Disapproves the Tax and Salary Act.

PROVISIONS WERE TOO INDEFINITE.

With Certain Suggested Amendments the Governor Will Take Pleasure in Signing the Bill.

Before the House adjourned yesterday afternoon, H. B. No. 5, intrusted by Neister of Salt Lake, relating to taxes of the House, was voted down.

State of Utah, Executive Office, Salt Lake City, Jan. 23, 1890.

To the House of Representatives:

I respectfully return herewith, without my approval, H. B. No. 5, An act to regulate the fees to be charged for legal services, and other county officers for services rendered in official capacity.

The bill provides that members of legislative assemblies may draw into the proper treasury, in my opinion this provision is too indefinite, as the law ought to provide with certainty the proper amount to be paid to each member for his services, in the case of clerks of county courts, who, under the Constitution, are ex-officio clerks of district courts, fees for which, in my opinion, the members of each portion of their duties may rightfully receive in one treasury and those rendered by another capacity in another capacity, should be paid in the same proportion as the members of the assembly in the minds of officers as to whom treasury the members should be paid first. It should also require them to make the payment from time to time.

Another objection to the measure is that after the date of its approval some of the officers mentioned would have no expenses to pay, and others would have expenses, and the bare suggestion of such a possibility, will no doubt in sight, be sufficient to cause an official party to oppose it. I am of the opinion that condition by a very bill which may be retroactive, yet there is no way of determining that fact in advance. I suggest, therefore, that the bill be referred to the committee on finance, with a provision to the effect that compensation of officers who, previous to the passage of the act, received fees for compensation, should be paid in arrears, as may be necessary, and not at once.

The third objection is that the bill does not include all the officers which it should include. Section 2, article 21, of the Constitution of the State of Utah, says: "Legislators shall provide by law the fees which shall be collected by all officers within the State." The bill omits the salaries of the auditors, the fees for the performance of official duties, and charges others: Recorder of marks and brands, county recorder, county coroner, county attorney, etc.

If the bill shall be amended to cover these objections, I shall have pleasure in approving it. Very respectfully,

FIRST READING OF BILLS.

H. C. H. No. 2, by Allen, demanding the recall of Ambrose Haynes, H. B. No. 23, by private corporations committee, authorizing the taking of acknowledgments in the organizations of corporations, by county clerks.

INTRODUCED OF NEW BILLS.

Harris introduced H. B. No. 57, a bill for an act providing for the appointment of official court stenographers. It provides that the appointment by the judge of each district court, of a competent shorthand reporter, who shall hold office during the pleasure of the judge making the appointment. His compensation for services to be paid at \$100 per day, or each day he is in actual attendance upon the court. He is also allowed mileage at the rate of 10 cents per mile, one way in traveling from one county to another to attend different sessions of the court, which mileage shall be paid by the respective counties, pro rata.

There introduced H. B. No. 58, a bill for an act amending section 202B, chapter 10, Compiled Laws of 1889. The bill amends the statute of limitations in the existing revenue laws. It provides that the board of equitation must by September 1st, instead of October 1st, as in the present law, transmit to the tax collector the corrected returns and make taxes delinquent December 1st instead of November 1st, as at present.


PASSAGE OF BILLS.
