An Early Utah Veteran Passes Away at a Ripe Old Age.

Colonia Juarez, Mex., Nov. 21.-In the Semi-Weekly News of Nov. 12, in an article headed "Battalion Burial Ground." the name Milton Kelley is printed Milton Helley. The name of Jos. W. Richards was omitted by me in making out the list of those burled at Pueblo. He died at Pueblo on the 21st of November, 1846, about one month be-fore my arrival at that place, and he was undoubtedly the first of the bat-talion to die at Pueblo.
