CRIME UNHEARTED... Remains of Mrs. N. A. Wilkins of Oakland Found Buried in Quicklime.

HUSBAND NOW IN CUSTODY... Woman Asserts He Endeavored to Induce Her to Go Away With Him.

San Francisco, Nov. 25.—The police of Oakland today unearthed a most diabolical crime and have taken into custody N. A. Wilkins, a stationary engineer, and will charge him with the murder of his wife, whose remains were found buried in quicklime underneath a shed in the yard of the Wilkins home in Elmhurst, a suburb of Oakland.

Mrs. Wilkins has not been seen around her home by the neighbors for several days. It was known that she was soon to give birth to a child, and inquiries regarding her whereabouts by the neighbors elicited the response from Wilkins that she had gone to the home of her parents in the city. A friend of the dead woman, Mrs. J. M. Anderson of San Francisco, had been staying at the Wilkins home during the past few days, and now asserts that Wilkins had endeavored to induce her to leave her husband and go away with him. Her suspicions became aroused, and last night in a dream she saw the body of her former friend lying on the ground, with the arms crossed over the breast. She came to San Francisco and told her husband of the strange incident, this morning the two went to the office of police of Oakland and told the story.
