## COMPANIES MUST REGISTER.

## Else They Cannot Have Benefit of the Canadian Courts.

Vancouver, B. C., Dec, 2.-."A foreign company not registered in this prov-ince cannot make use of our courts." This was the decision of the full court handed down yesterday in the court handed down yesterday in the sult of Lilly, Bogardus & Co., of Scat-tie, against A. R. Johnson & Co., of Victoria, and Nanaimo. The decision sets aside the judgment of \$12,000 which the Seattle firm obtained recently agaist Johnston & Co., in connection with a large contract for the supply of salmon for Japanese markets. The Se-stille Gem first obtained its indement attle firm first obtained its judgment in the courts of Washington state. Then it sued on the judgment in Vancouver, Justice Martin deciding in its favor not Justice Martin deciding in its layor hot only upon the American judgments but upon the merits. The point as to the rights of a foreign and unregistered company in seeking a remedy in the courts of this province was not then raised. The decision is the first of its kind in this province.
