COUNCIL CONVENTIONS.

FIFTH COUNCIL DISTRICT.

The People's Party Convention of the Fifth Council District, comprising the Second and Fifth precincts of this city, met in the City Hall at 12 o'clock today.

Wm. M. Stewart was elected chairman and Willard Done secretary of the temporary organization.

A committee on credentials was appointed, consisting of Henry Wallace, John G. Midgley and Willard C. Burton. Their report showed 18 delegates present—ten from the Tenth and eight from the Twelfth representative district.

The temporary organization was made permanent.

David Woodmansee was made chaplain and Jas. H. Poulton sergeant-at-arms.

After prayer by the chaplain, Hon. James H. Moyle was nominated by the Tenth district delegation, and Wm. M. Stewart by the Twelfth district delegation. Mr. Stewart declined. Mr. Moyle was then nominated by acclamation, and the convention adjourned.

SIXTH COUNCIL DISTRICT.

The Sixth Council District convention met in the Seventeenth District schoolhouse.

Heber M. Wells was elected chairman and Joseph Lyons secretary.

The following nominations for the Legislative Council were made: R. W. Young, F. S. Richards and John N. Pike.

One of the delegates announced the refusal of Mr. Young to accept the nomination; and Mr. Pike withdrew his name, and urged that of F. S. Richards.

A free and somewhat protracted discussion of the merits of the candidates ensued, but the firm withdrawal of Messrs. Young and Pike left the name of Mr. Richards alone before the convention, and he was nominated unanimously by acclamation.

The following were appointed a standing committee of the People's Party for the Sixth Council District: E. A. Folland, Third Precinct; Heber M. Wells, Fourth Precinct; John C. McKay, Granger; John N. Pike, at large. The above were chosen from the Eleventh Representative District.
