PORT VOTES

GAINED BY ROLAPP

Judge Morse Still Passing on Challenged Ballots—Hearing Adjourned Till Monday.

HAPPY WEDDING CHIMES.

Damage Suit for Loss of a Leg—Clark Recitals—Funerals Sunday—News Briefs.

Ogden, Utah, March 11.—As a result of the recounting of ballots to date, in the judgeship contest case, Howell has a net loss of 40 votes. He lost 34 votes in Weber county, so that Rolapp carried it by 22 as appeared by the returns of the judges of election as certified by the board of canvassers. This would mean a net gain of 34 for Rolapp in Weber county. Two districts in Jordan county were completed by the recount of the challenged ballots, and Howell lost four, and Peterson won two, making a net gain of 10 for Rolapp on the recount to date. During the recount of challenges to the two Morgan county districts, Judge Morse refused to sustain challenges on the ground that names had been written in the ballots by other than the voters. This is taken as an indication that the ballots of the precincts of the Morgan county districts, written names of Republican candidates for precinct officers on the ballot, will be counted. However, there are other questions affecting each particular district, and each particular ballot, so that it is impossible to predict what the rulings will be.

In Davis county a large number of ballots have been challenged because the judges found them improperly and such a manner that when the voter had returned the ballot to the judge of election the latter found, in fact, the ballot torn at the end of the seal, open it sufficiently so that he could see whether or not there was a cross under the Republican emblem or not. The result, also, of folding the ballots in this way was that in tearing off the ends of the voted ballots the judge tore off also the entire lower part of the ticket, removing the names of the candidates for the precinct officers, and making it a disgraceful ballot.

Judge Morse adjourned court early yesterday afternoon until Monday, when the court will be resumed.

SUIT FOR LOSS OF A LEG.

R. H. Boman will file a suit against the Southern Pacific company for \$20,000, alleged to be due him as compensation for the loss of a leg and other injuries received while in the employ of the company as a brakeman Oct. 4, 1929, while running along the tracks on a projecting bolt or other obstruction. The accident happened between Winnemucca and Sparks about 7 o'clock in the evening.

DEATH OF GEORGE E. MURPHY.

George E. Murphy, son of W. D. Murphy, died at his home at 234 Lincoln avenue, of meningitis, after an illness of about one month. The young man was a telephone operator for the Southern Pacific Railway company, and had been employed on the cut-off. Funeral notice will be given later.
