

COACH WEEK AT THE UNIVERSITY.

Four of Them on the Hill Pound
log Football Into the
Line.

GETTING READY FOR "AGGIES."

Logan Team is Coming Here Satur-
day With a Determination to
Hold the Championship.

This is coach week at the University. There are four of them up there on the hill, and they are pounding football into the line, like football was never pound-
ed in before. To win's the thing, and Saturday's the day. If there is anyway to do it Utah is out to find the way. Defense is the problem. At the University the whole coaching board is on the field. Channing, Maddock, Callahan and Plummer are all at work principally with the guards and ends. The maddox is saving 600 seats for Logan, and as many more for Utah rooters, who will attend in two sections, one of them composed entirely of college women. Tomorrow at 11 o'clock a final yell and song contest will be held to per-

fect the game. The teams will be on the field, the yell and song contest will be over, and then they will get the ball. The game will be called at 2:30 instead of 3:00 as usual in order to accommodate visitors from Logan, who desire to return on the evening train.
