Bradford Throws Schatz and Hardy

Dutton, Mont., March 24.—The six-day police skating race ended tonight in a small riot in which two arrests were made by the police, whose presence was necessary before order could be restored. Through a misunderstanding, the racers failed to note the signal of the end of the race and sped on. While endeavoring to make a sharp turn, Schatz of Salt Lake swerved too acutely and bravely saved himself from a fall, grabbing Bradford. On the other hand, it was noted that the racers were still going despite the signal to stop; apparently thought some one was being jibbed, and the mob charged onto the course and the last lap. The race ended tied with the Salt Lake and Butte teams on even footing.

Frank Bryan of the Butte rink, it is understood, has posted the money for Bradford, and is willing to take a chance against the skater who has made so far in the Montana city and the Butte papers give the boys a great send-off for their splendid work in the race. They have the full support of the public for the rights committed on the local racers and demand that they be given a square deal. Schatz is referred to as a plowman and it is admitted that he is a good skater in the western country. The team has certainly shown up the Butte contingent and given them an idea of what is in store.

Lester H. O'Mara, manager of O'Mara sent out contracts to teams in all the principal western cities for the 25-minute-each-night-six-day-race, and the fastest skaters in the country are lined up hand for the event, which will start on the evening of April 5 at the local rink.
