## Dynamiters are at Work Again on Provo What the Law Says About Such Methods

Dynamiters are at work along the Provo river again this season and honest fishermen who whip the waters with fly and hook are complaining bitterly against such procedure. There is a law against dynamiting of fish. Here it is. Section 104, Statutes of Utah, reads: "Use of Explosives or Drugs—It shall be unlawful for any person to kill or take any fish from the waters of the state by the use of any poison, deleterious or stupefying drug, giant powder or quick lime or any explosive substance whatever, or to place or to use in or on the surface of such waters any giant powder, quick lime, or any explosive substance or any poison, deleterious or stupefying drug, or to have in his possession any fish killed or taken by the use of any of these substances. Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this statute shall be punishable by a fine in any sum not less than \$100 for each offense or imprisonment in the county jail not less than 30 days nor more than 120 days or by both such fine and imprisonment. That law is simple enough for a child to interpret and officials of counties have no excuse for not doing their duty under its provisions. Every season for years past stories of dynamiting along the Provo, Weber and other rivers have been brought to the ears of the county officials yet little or nothing has ever been done towards punishing the offenders as provided by law. The writer, during camping trips along various rivers, has heard the boom of dynamiters' charges all night long and dead fish have floated on the river's surface the next morning. It would seem no trouble would be experienced in catching the dynamiters who do this kind of work for they are always in the neighborhood of the spot selected to drop the powder. The proper authorities should get busy.
