He had to ride at a killing pace, but he did it gracefully and it looked easy for him.

Bill Samuelson and Hopper formed the hardest combination. Samuelson did the donkey work for Hopper, and it was expected that the specky Chicago boy would be able to land first money. Before the race was anything like over, some of the race was lookling. Samuelson pulled hopper around at terrific speed and a lap from home Hopper started his sprint. Lawson was watching him, however, and suddenly neshot high on the bank and with grace ull metions began to unwind his electine sprint, the sprint that won the world's champtonship for him. Faster and faster he rode, the other riders straining every nerve to keep ahead of him, but they were quickly overtaken. Just before reaching the tape Lawson shot ahead, winning by two lengths.

This event was the main one of the evening, although the five-mile in torrace was interesting and exciting. The riders who participated in it worked the machines for about all they were worta, and young Hengren set a 1:20 pice throughout and managed to cross over the tape a winner. 
