WESTERN.

SAN FRANCISCO, S.—The sales of the San Francisco stock board, last week, aggregate two millions, being two hundred thousand less than the week previous.

The amount of money in the city treasury on the 1st Inst. was \$301,658.

There are 305 inmates in the alms house.

One grain merchant in the city is reported having eighty-five ships on the way to him, to carry grain to Liverpool. Fifteen are now due.

The new town of Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, Utah, was incorporated to-day, with a capital of \$240,000.

EUROPEAN.

MADRID.—In consequence of the passage of the bill abolishing constitutional guarantees, the irreconcileable depositors withdrew from the Cortes, which again convened to restore quiet in Madrid. Troops are yet posted at various points throughout the city, and measures have been taken by the authorities for the suppression of disturbances.

MADRID.—A draft of the new constitution was submitted to the Cortes to-day, which was appointed to draw up the measure. It provides that the President of the republic must be born in Spain, and that the country is divided into ages. The country is divided into ages. The necessity of each canton is to consist of 100,000 inhabitants, to be elected by universal suffrage. Cuba and Porto Rico are to be associated with the cantons of Spain, and the central power is authorized to make constitutional guarantees and to fix levies for troops without first consulting the authorities of the cantons.

FLORENCE.—A dispatch from Belluno, 100 miles north of Venice, says a shock of earthquake was felt in that city and adjacent country this a.m.

A volcano near Farra, ten miles from Belluno, which has been quiet for some time, has experienced an eruption, and the water of the lake in the vicinity is boiling.

LONDON, S.—Disputes from New York, regarding the reduction in the value of debts, have been receipts from internal revenue for the fiscal year were several millions in excess of the estimates, caused a bitter feeling in the market for American stocks.
