CACTUS ON WAY
TO DIVIDENDS

Big Beaver County Property Producing a Car of Crude Oil Per Day.

CONCENTRATE ALL VELVET.

Net Earnings Will Approximate Close To \$200,000 This Month—One Of The Big Ones.

General Manager Lafayette Hanchett of the newhouse mine expects to leave this evening on an inspection trip to the big Cactus property in Beaver county. Developments have been taking place so rapidly since his last trip to the property that he has been unable to keep pace with them, notwithstanding that he receives regular daily reports from Supt. Moffatt.

"No one knows yet how big the rich ore body encountered in the 801 cross-cut on the 400 level really is," said Mr. Hanchett, "but we have gone into it far enough to demonstrate to our satisfaction that it is an immense one. Mr. Moffatt is getting out about a car of crude ore a day, while the mill is handling from 800 to 1,000 tons."

It is understood that the crude ore will pay all the operating expenses of the property this month, while the earnings from the mill will be clear profit with two cars of concentrate coming in constantly. It means that the Cactus mine is making velvet at the rate of a sum bordering on the \$200,000 mark, or at the rate of \$8 per share per month. Certainly there are mighty few mines anywhere in the country doing as well.

BIG SUNFLOWER.

Sensational Ore Found in This Well Known Stateline Property.

Hon. John Parry, member of the lower house of the legislature, has had assayed a sample of ore from the Big Sunflower mine in the Stateline district in Iron county, which showed values of 5,000 ounces in silver and \$25,000 in gold. This sample, Mr. Parry stated, was taken from across an 8-inch streak. In addition to the foregoing there is a 3-foot body of ore that will average 250 ounces in silver and \$1,250 in gold. THE FEDERAL ELY.

W. J. Craig Says Conditions Look Good To Him at Property.

W. J. Craig, manager of the Federal Ely property, at Ely, Nev., returned yesterday afternoon from a trip of inspection and reports conditions very satisfactory. In fact, he puts the Federal Ely down as being one of the banner propositions of the camp.

Mr. Craig states that good headway is being made in the tunnel and doing as well as could be expected in the shaft without the necessary mining timbers. The shaft has been driven to the 100-foot level and here, he says, had to cease pending the arrival of timbers. Sulphides were encountered in the level, the working was driven through sulphides that ranged from 1 to 2 1/2 per cent copper. A cross cut was run both ways from the bottom of the shaft, 52 feet in one direction and 36 feet in the opposite direction, and the entire distance of 88 feet was covered.
