THE PRESIDENT FULLY UPHOLD.

By Telegram to the Navy.

Senate.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—Van Wyck

offered a resolution declaring it to be

the judgment of the Senate that a con-

stitutional amendment should be sub-

mitted to the people for the election

of senators directly by the voters

and that the bill for the election of

senators by the House be referred to

the committee on the subject of the

House substitute for the fishery

retail bill was disagreed to and a

conference was asked.

Edmunds, Frye and Morgan were ap-

pointed Senate conferees.

The bill and amendments then went

over until to-morrow.

A resolution declaring Senator In-

galls chairman, president pro tem, of

the Senate was agreed to until to-mor-

row.

The House bill to extend the laws of

the United States over certain

UNORGANIZED TERRITORY

south of the State of Kansas was

passed with amendments.

The Senate bill to authorize the con-

struction of a bridge by the Chicago,

St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha Railway

Company over the River at

St. Paul, Minnesota, was passed.

The Senate bill to authorize the con-

struction of a railroad bridge across the

Mississippi River at Grand Tower,

Illinois, was taken from the calendar.

Amendments were agreed to requiring

the principal span to be 600 feet and

the other spans 500 feet, and the bill

passed.

Other bills passed were as follows:

The Senate bill to authorize the con-

struction of a bridge across the Kansas

River below the falls; the Senate

bills authorizing the

CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGES

across the Red River of the North; the

Senate bill granting to the Rocky Moun-

tain & Pacific Railway Company a right

of way through a portion of the Crow

Indian reservation, in Montana; Terri-

tory.

The Senate then proceeded to the

consideration of the Senate pleuro-

pneumonia bill.

Edmunds gave notice of an amend-

ment which he would offer as a sub-

stitute for the bill. It proposed an

appropriation of \$100,000, to be ex-

penditure under the direction of the

President and through the commis-

sioner of agriculture, to aid the au-

thorities of the several States in pre-

venting the spread of pleuro-pneu-

monia, the appropriation to expire in

two years.

The bill was amended so as to have

the commissioner appointed by the

President of the United States, with-

out the necessity of confirmation by

the Senate.

The various amendments to the bill

giving to the President of the United

States the authority which had been

proposed to be given to the commis-

sioner of agriculture were agreed to

without further action.

Adjourned.
