

CURIOUS COMPLAINT

Russians Allege Brutal Treatment in Alaskan Settlements

AT THE HANDS OF THE AMERICANS.

No Official Information Received in Washington, but an Investigation is Underway.

New York, Jan. 12.—A dispatch to the Herald from St. Petersburg, dated Jan. 10, contains a sensational article written by a Russian correspondent, alleging that the Russian government is sending a large number of its subjects to Alaska to be treated in a brutal manner by the Americans.

It is claimed that a number of the company's agents entered a Greek orthodox church during service with arms in their hands to drive the congregation out to work and that the Russian teacher having refused to give his lessons in English, the Americans threatened to burn down the school.

General condemnation is brought against the government at Washington for having the administration of Alaska in the hands of a trading company, which, it is claimed, is in the interest of the Americans.

No official information received in Washington, but an investigation is under way.

New York, Jan. 12.—A special to the Herald from Washington says: Absolutely no official information has been received in regard to the alleged persecution of Russian residents of the territory of Alaska by the North American Commercial company.
