PANAMA CANAL CO.

Colombia Not Allowed to Participate in stockholder's meeting Paris, Dec. 29 .- The attitude which the new Panama company will adopt with respect to acceptance of the offer of the United States for its property, is forecasted by the action of the com-pany in the excluding of the representatives of Colombia from participation in the meeting to be held tomorrow. As the proprietor of 50,000 shares, Co-lombia has been represented each year at the annual meetings by M. Semper, lombia has been represented each year at the annual meetings by M. Semper, who was authorized to act in its behalf. This year, owing to the recent events at the isthmus, the administrative council of the company declined to ac-mit M. Semper to the meetting, on the ground that the original Colombian bonds had become justly subject to lit-igation. Colombia declined to bow to this decision, and thereupon Senor Uribe, thei consul general, appealed to the courts for an order upon the com-pany to issue a card of admission to M. Semper. Attorneys for Colombia ap-peared before M. Ditte, president of the chamber of first instance. Attorney Dubuit represented the Panama Canal company. M. Ditte decided that he could not pass on the question because the basis of the matter was a question raised owing to a claim of the republic of Panama.
