

WORLD'S FAIR NOTES.

South French and the East India exhibit to have a worthy exhibit at the Exposition.

A collective exhibit at the World's Fair by the various colleges, universities and the United States is well secured.

It is probable that a number of genuine Australian sheep, the finest specimens living, will be exhibited at the World's Fair.

The Indian exhibit at the World's Fair will include representatives of every tribe from the extreme north to the south of the continent.

Labor asks that the World's Fair be open on Monday. The labor organizations of the country are fast putting themselves on record to this effect.

The Women's Pharmaceutical Association of Illinois is planning to conduct a model pharmacy in the Illinois building at the World's Fair.

The Paper Trade Club of Chicago, representing nearly all the paper manufacturers of the city, is arranging for an interesting display at the World's Fair.

A solid gold brick, weighing 500 pounds and worth \$125,000, will be exhibited in the Mines and Metals building at the World's Fair by a Helena, Montana, mine owner.

Chief Ives, who is in Europe in the interest of the fine arts department at the World's Fair, has written that the French and American artists in Paris are all going with enthusiasm for the fair.

Through the efforts of the department of publicity and promotion the World's Fair is known from one end of the world to the other, and all people are taking an extraordinary interest in it.

Japan has applied for space in the World's Fair Mines and Metals building, a fine collection of the celebrated Japanese alloys and bronze preparations.

Three World's Fair commissioners from France are in Chicago, and are endeavoring to secure the building which will be the headquarters of France at the fair, and in making arrangements for installing the French exhibit.

The chair in which Thomas Jefferson sat while writing the Declaration of Independence is now owned by the Philadelphia Society, Philadelphia. It is reported that this interesting relic will be exhibited at the World's Fair.

The high school of San Diego, Cal., will give a grand Fourth of July celebration and devote the proceeds to ward making a magnificent collection of the World's Fair. The specimens will be reserved in alcohol and properly labeled, etc.

A handsome new being, fitted out in all the way to the world's regions to not ten or twelve Egyptian families, fifty or sixty persons in all, for exhibiting at the World's Fair. Days, bags, implements, utensils and everything necessary to show Egyptian life will also be prepared.

An exhibit of bells will be made at the World's Fair by a large number of young women in this country, and the fair is planning to display it in a reproduction of the Year Kubok (king of bells), the famous broken bell of yore, which was broken in diameter and 22 feet 3 inches high, weighs 11,722 pounds, and is used as a chapel.

The Ohio State Agricultural and Mechanical Society, which is exhibiting at the World's Fair, among many other interesting articles, a collection of specimens of old candles and State bank money. It has already gathered several hundred specimens. One of the most interesting is a Marmon oil lamp, the structure of Joseph Smith, the founder of the Mormon faith.

The World's Fair grounds and buildings, now nearing completion, are now being decorated with a most beautiful and interesting spectacle that not only do from 5,000 to 12,000 people a day, at a cost of 25 cents a piece, inspect them, but the great number of travelers who pass through Chicago devote a day or more in the same purpose.
