ANOTHER DISASTER.

CONTROL OF TYPHOID.

The prevalence of typhoid fever in several parts of the state recalls the fact that this dread disease is generally spread by carelessness in country places.

The government experts on insects published a few years ago that mosquitoes and house flies transfer two diseases that, in country districts, are easily preventable—malaria and typhoid fever.

These are country diseases; that is, while they often occur in large cities, they most frequently abound at the farm and village.

The malarial mosquito does not accommodate itself well to city conditions, but is found swarming in the country wherever still pools and small accumulations of surface water occur.

Typoid fever in cities may be prevented by the filtration of water, the sterilization of milk, and the disinfection of the excreta of typhoid patients.
