THE COUNCIL ARRANGED.

Mayor Harkin does well in calling the City Council's attention to the municipal financial situation, even at this late day.

It was quite characteristic of the Council that the Mayor's message was treated with dignity. Men whose responsibilities are so well defined of public opinion and apparent opposition to the interests were appointed to investigate.

By a strictly party vote—meaning that all the Democrats voted one way and all the Republicans the other way—the national House of Representatives yesterday passed the Tucker bill to repeal the Federal election law.

A REPEAL BILL PASSED.

The majority for repeal was twenty-two to ten. This is significant in two important respects: it shows that the temporary mixing up of the parties regarding the silver question has reference to that subject only and that as to all political questions the Democrats are Democratic and the Republicans are strongly inclined their way as ever.

As stated by a man of the Democrats in the debate preceding the passage of the bill, the Democrats did not intend to be divided in their vote; that they were secured beyond all probability we expect that organization will be made a matter of party history. This does not refer altogether to money equally, as will be naturally expected in all the Democratic ranks.

Another result may be the disruption of the naturally hostile and at present prevailing belief in the Democratic line. With those states in complete and unimpeded control of their own political affairs, the band of mutual action for the attainment of common ends which bound them together will be relaxed.
