Our correspondent has neglected, or forgotten to furnish the names of the varieties of apples he measured, which is one of the most important items to be considered. The "Twenty Ounce," "Pumpkin Vine Baldwin," and many other varieties are large, but inferior in flavor when compared with the Porter, Maiden's Blush, Spitzenburg, Northern Spy, Winter Pearmain and dozens of others. We know of seedlings that are very large, but being almost totally destitute of flavor, they are considered worthless.

In passing along the street the other day we had the curiosity to measure some apples which a little girl was carrying to market, and the first we picked from the basket was 14 inches in circumference. We call that a large apple, but size is only one of the qualities requisite to make an apple good for cul- GLASS, CHINA & QUEENSWARE, tivation.
