James Huntsman's orchard, and of beholding something superior to anything therein reported. Br. Huntsman has quite a number of trees bearing very large and fine looking apples, but one tree in particular bears apples of an extraordinary size. Several which I measured were nearly 12 inches in circumference, and the largest I saw measured 13 3/8 inches. Who can beat that? Hoping you will not esteem me troublesome, I am yours,

Our correspondent has neglected, or forgotten to furnish the names of the varieties of apples he measured, which is one of the most important items to be considered. The "Twenty Ounce," "Pumpkin Vine Baldwin," and many other varieties are large, but inferior in flavor when compared with the Porter, Maiden's Blush, Spitzenburg, Northern Spy, Winter Pearmain and dozens of others. We know of seedlings that are very large, but being almost totally destitute of flavor, they are considered worthless.

In passing along the street the other day we had the curiosity to measure some apples which a little girl was carrying to market, and the first we picked from the basket was 14 inches in circumference. We call that a large apple, but size is only one of the qualities requisite to make an apple good for cultivation.

The "Twenty Ounce" is so called from its size and weight, and it is supposed by some to be a first class apple, but we never thought it so.

Perhaps our correspondent, or br. Starley will let us know what kinds of fruit are best adapted to Millard county.
