## GOOD ROADS MAN COMING TO UTAH

Government Engineer to Address  
Convention to be Held in  
January.

### FOREMOST AMERICAN EXPERT

Secretary Wilson Grants Request  
Transmitted by Senator  
Reed Smoot.

In the problem of working up interest in Utah in a main state highway as a beginning towards the development of an extensive system of good roads, Utah is to be assisted by all the resources of the United States government, so far as government engineers have worked out the problems of scientific road building.

At the Good Roads convention scheduled to be held in the Salt Lake theater Jan. 14, Logan W. Page, director of the government's public roads, and the foremost American authority on road building, will be present.

His coming here is the result of a request made by Orson H. Hewlett, upon the government of agriculture for Utah's good roads movement.

The success that attended his efforts is indicated in the following telegram received by Gov. Cutler:

"Gov. John C. Cutler, Salt Lake City: 'See' Wilson promised me today would have Mr. Page, head of good roads inquiry, attend meeting Jan. 14. 'REED SMOOT.'"

### WITH MILITARY HONORS.

Lieut. John L. Shepherd Laid to Rest  
In Post Cemetery.

There was a military funeral yesterday afternoon at Fort Douglas when the remains of Lieut. John L. Shepherd, assistant surgeon, U. S. A., were laid to rest in the post cemetery. Dr. Shepherd died from appendicitis in Holy Cross hospital Friday night, after being at this station but a short time. He was much liked by both officers and men, so there was a large attendance at the funeral. The entire regiment turned out in full uniform at 2 p. m. in front of the deceased officer's quarters, whence the casket, wrapped in an American flag, was borne by pallbearers detailed from the ranks of the Fifteenth infantry. Officers of the regiment walked beside it. Headed by the regimental band, the casket was placed on the funeral caisson, when the entire procession marched to the cemetery one mile distant. Impressive services were conducted there by Chaplain Charles J. Clement, and the body was lowered into the grave. The firing detail then wheeled into line beside the grave over which the customary three volleys were fired. Taps from a trumpet completed the ceremony.
