RATE CASE HEARING CONCLUDED IN OGDEN

Argument Taken to Salt Lake.
Where Arguments Will be Heard Saturday.

OGDEN, Oct. 29.—The hearing of the rate discrimination case before Interstate Commerce Commission, C. A. Peasey was concluded yesterday afternoon and adjournment was taken until next Saturday morning at Salt Lake City, when four members of the interstate commerce commission will hear the arguments of the attorneys for both sides.

The chief witness for the complainants was William Glasmann, president of the Four-state Fair association, who endeavored to show that Ogden was discriminated against by the railroads not only in the matter of fair rates but in the regular tariffs of the roads. He stated that the rate from Rock Springs, Wyoming, to Ogden was \$7.70 and the rates from Rock Springs to Salt Lake City, 27 miles farther, were \$11.50.

Commissioner Prouty asked Mr. Glasmann what the cost of a ticket from Rock Springs to Ogden would be at the Salt Lake rate. He responded, \$11.50.

A feature of the testimony particularly gratifying to the people of Ogden was that given by D. E. Burley, general passenger agent of the Oregon Short Line company, that during the months of September and October, at the Four-state fair which was held in Ogden, and the Mormon Church general conference and state fair held in Salt Lake City, the railroad company sold more than half as many tickets this year to Ogden as it did to Salt Lake City.

In support of the testimony of Mr. Burley the following table was intro-

duced:

From common territory to both points—number of tickets sold:

1908 1909

Ogden and return for the Four-state fair..... 1,929 5,233

Salt Lake City for common and state fair..... 5,182 6,138

In addition to the above table, the railroad company introduced a number of tariff sheets showing the rates that have been made semi-annually for the Mormon Church general conference and the state fair, also the rates for the round trip granted to Ogden during the past two years.

U. S. IMMIGRANT INSPECTOR.

OGDEN, Oct. 29.—United States Immigration Inspector Vaine Jantinen was in Ogden Thursday investigating the standing of Wong Gee, manager of the Wah Sing Lung company, who has recently applied to the department of immigration to be allowed to bring his son, Wong Loy Wong, to this country for the purpose of assimilating the boy into the "good American" citizen of his. The lad is being held at San Francisco pending the investigation of the commercial status of his father and it is more than likely that he will be allowed to remain in this country, as the Wah Sing Lung company is an old, well-established firm, and is highly respected by local business men. Mr. Jantinen also made his visits to certain parts of the city connected with his work in the government service and called on the local police officers and the sheriff for the purpose of ascertaining whether any foreigners were being held as prisoners at the present time.

POLICE COURT.

OGDEN, Oct. 29.—Arthur Hickman and James A. Moore both pleaded guilty to being drunk and were sentenced to pay \$5 and spend five days in jail. G. Ted, R. Parr, C. Murphy and L. Packard, four young men ranging from 16 to 18 years of age, all from prominent families of Ogden, were arraigned in court Thursday morning charged with having placed a pile of railroad ties on the tracks near the Ogden Rapid Transit company last week, and thereby being the cause of derailing a car, although no one was injured. They pled guilty and stated that they were only trying to play a trick on the man and little thought of the seriousness of their act. Parr, Murphy and Packard were bound over to the district court under \$50 bonds each, and were placed under \$250 bonds. Court was also adjourned on the charge of forgery and placed under bonds in the sum of \$50 each.
