

JOE GANS WINS FROM NATIVE SON

Britt Breaks Arm Trying to Land On Dusky Champion.

JIMMY IS OUTCLASSED.

Battling Nelson at Ringside Issues Challenge to Fight Californian Win or Lose—Ringside Bets.

San Francisco, Sept. 9.—A left swing to the body, cleverly blocked by Joe Gans, cost Jimmy Britt any chance he might have had to win the lightweight championship of the world today and brought to a close five rounds of fast fighting, witnessed by a crowd of about 14,000 people at Recreation Park. The blow caught by Gans on his elbow, was struck in the middle of the fourth round. It broke Britt's wrist and though he went again in the fifth round, he was helpless in both offense and defense. It was not until this round that he informed his seconds of the mishap.

"What's the use of my going on? I can't fight and nothing can help me," said Britt. Captain of Police Gleason was notified at the ringside and stopped the fight. Referee Weisen gave the decision to Gans. Three doctors examined Britt and diagnosed the injury was a fracture and dislocation of the lower end of the radius, the innermost bone of the wrist. Whether it was a genuine fracture or not, Britt showed no apparent suffering while he was manipulating his wrist, the tears rolled unchecked down his cheeks.

"I was utterly helpless," he said. "I could not even hold up my left hand after I broke it. I had no guard for 'Gans' left and no punch except with my right."

The fight, which lasted was a slugfest match. It was a hard-fought battle. A trained observer that Britt had no chance to win from the negro. For the first time in his life, he was outwitted.

SCENES AT RINGSIDE.

While Britt says that the delay was caused by Gans insisting that his money

was paid up before he entered the ring. The money was put up. At 2:30 both fighters stripped. Britt wore turkey red running trunks. Gans had on white silk trunks. He waded in the top with the American flag.

After being photographed the ring was cleared for action. Time was called at 2:30 p. m.

At 2:40 p. m. Battling Nelson was introduced. He leaped a challenge to Jimmie Britt, regardless of whether the latter won or lost. Frankie Neff, the bantamweight, who had been a favorite to win, was eliminated in the first round.

The two fighters weighed in at 2:40 p. m. The scales were set at 123 pounds. Britt trembled the bar. The bar did not move. The scales were reset. It was judged that Britt did not top Gans' weight by more than two ounces. It was agreed that the men should have 15 seconds to weigh in again.

At 2:50 Gans entered the ring. He was introduced as the only lightweight champion of the world and was greeted with roars of applause. Gans was seconded by Alvin Karpis, the boxer.

Britt entered the ring at 3:20 o'clock. He was introduced as a native son of the golden west and one of the greatest boys to come along. Step by step he went into the fourth with a lightning-like straight left that brought a screech from the ring. He was introduced as the only lightweight champion of the world and was greeted with roars of applause. Gans was seconded by Alvin Karpis, the boxer.

Britt's head was to the right. Gans had the advantage as the bell stopped a fierce rally.

Round One—Britt quickly shot his left to Gans' ribs. They snarled. Britt swang a fearful left that caught Gans on the nose. Gans was down. Britt recovered. Britt had a shade the better of the round.

Round Two—At close range Gans rocked Britt's head with his right to the face. Gans had the advantage as the bell stopped a fierce rally.
