Large sections of the liberal constituencies are conscientiously opposed to allowing an atheist to sit in Parliament; hence members will find themselves in an unpleasant dilemma between supporting their leaders and offending their constituents.

A Berlin correspondent has advised from St. Petersburg that the Chinese envoy has postponed his departure from Paris for St. Petersburg four weeks. The Chinese embassy at St. Petersburg is informed from Peking that Chung How will be executed in a month.

A Paris dispatch says: The first sign of a Communist demonstration on Sunday, was given by the assembling of a small knot of people around the Bastille column, who were soon ordered by the police to disperse. Shortly after, two men arrived with red wreaths but were immediately arrested. The fact of their arrest caused a crowd of 500 or 600 people, and an unsuccessful attempt was made to rescue the prisoners. Blows were exchanged and several would-be rescuers arrested. Three of the persons arrested proved to be reporters, and were immediately released. At 2 o'clock p. m. 40 persons assembled at the Bastille column, but were speedily dispersed by the police. At 3 o'clock a procession of 600 people, many carrying red bouquets and wreaths, filed in front of the wall where the Communists were shot in 1871, placing the flowers against the wall as they passed. At 4.30 there were three more arrests, but this was the last incident of the day's proceedings.

On the arrival at Mallow, Ireland, on Sunday, of the train containing emigrants, from Kerry, on their way to America, the train was stormed by 500 men of the South Cork militia, who beat the emigrants unmercifully and ousted them from the carriages. Some emigrants were seriously injured. The militia had just been disbanded after their annual training.

P. J. Smythe has withdrawn his resignation of his seat in Parliament. He explains his resolve to resign was taken hastily.

At an interview between Goschen and Baron Von Hoymerle, the latter, though he fully conceded the necessity of a complete carrying out of the Berlin treaty, pointed out that the treaty was regarded rather as providing for the regeneration of Turkey than as a weapon for destroying her.

Gen. Melikoff recently submitted to the Czar a proposal for the establishment of two House assemblies. The Czar deprecated the suggestion, and said he left the further reforms in the hands of the Czarovitch after his death.

The British Mission to Abdurrahman Khan, was received everywhere with distinction on the route.

Letters to Mahomed Jan, urging him to attack the British, lately in Ghuznee and Maidan, were found on Mustaufi Hobiboolah, who was recently arrested at Shirpur and proved to be written by him. Ayoob Khan continues to declare his intention to attack Candahar.

A deputation of Northern Ghilzais, who arrived at Cabul during the week, express themselves willing to accept any Ameer the government might select.

The impression grows stronger daily that the best hope of a final settlement centres in the establishment of friendly relations with Abdurrahman Khan, and in placing him upon the throne at Cabul.

It is said the prospect of the Western Powers using a pressure to compel Turkey to carry on the reforms prescribed by the Berlin treaty, caused Russia to endeavor to regain her influence in Turkey by adopting a more lenient course, and that the execution of the assassin of Col. Comeroff will not be insisted upon by Russia.

Prince Bismarck has declined to preside over the new European conference, and has nominated Prince Hohenlohe.
