The fact of their arrest caused a crowd of 500 or 600 people, and an unsuccessful attempt was made to rescue the prisoners. Blows were exchanged and several would-be rescuers arrested. Three of the persons arrested proved to be reporters, and were immediate-ly released. At 2 o'clock p. m. 40 persons assembled at the Bastile LETT & Co., Portland Maine. persons assembled at the Bastile column, but were speedily dispersed by the police. At 3 o'clock a procession of 600 people, many carrying red bouquets and wreaths, filed in front of the wall where the Communists were shot in 1871, placing the flowers against the wall as they passed. At 4.30 there were three more arrests, but this was the last incident of the day's




