CULLED FROM LATEST EXCHANGES. Cheyenne, Wyo., Sept. 6.-William Bogan, alias McCoy, was to-day con-victed of murder in the first degree.He killed deputy sheriff Charles Gunn at Lusk, in this Territory, January 15th last. The murder was brutal and un-provoked, and much satisfaction is expressed at McCoy's conviction. Me-Coy is a [Texas:desperado, and the sheriff from Hamilton County has been here waiting to take him should he have been released.

On Friday last as George Rowley was driving along the Almy road he saw a team and wagon going along ahead of him, with a man apparently intoxicated driving. Smoke was issuing from the wagon in large volumes and he whipped up his team in order to learn the cause. Just before he reached the wagon the man tumbled head first out on to the ground and badly bruised his face. Rowley called

to a man near by to hold his horses and he ran up, stopped the team and unhitched them from the wagon, which was loaded with flour, feed and vegetables. The bottom of the ve hicle was filled with straw and this was on fire and burning rapidly. at once procured water and put it out.

But for the timely discovery the wagon extinguished George turned his at-tention to the man, whose name is George Platt, and found out that the fall he received had sobered him up somewhat, so he hitched up the team, put the man on board and again start-ed him on his journey to the north-ward.-Uintah (Wyo.)
