

DEMOCRATS HOLD WARD PRIMARIES.

Delegates are Chosen for Precinct
Conventions to be Held
Monday Night.

FEW CONTESTS FOR PLACES.

Mayor Morris Appears to Have No Op-
position But Two Men After
Treasurership.

The Democratic primaries were held last night in every district of the city, except three, and the delegates are now ready to go ahead with the work of the ward and city conventions. The meetings last night were marked with an absence of strife, and a general agreement as to the personnel of the list of delegates. In most precincts the men were chosen without instructions, but in some they were instructed to vote for nomination of the present mayor. In the three districts where primaries were not held, it is stated that there was a misunderstanding as to the date, and that delegates will be chosen before the city convention.

In the contest for the position of city treasurer there was some split, a few wards instructed their delegates to vote for certain men for the city convention. It was reported that Stephen H. and Joseph E. Caltie both have many supporters for the nomination for city treasurer.
