ORDINANCE WILL COVER COAL MEN

Chief of Police Receives Opinion From City Attorney on Subject.

TO CONTINUE INVESTIGATION.

Barlow Says He Will Not Let Up on Dealers Who Deliver Shortweight Tons.

Chief of Police Barlow declares he has no intention of letting up on coal dealers who are guilty of shortweighting their customers. The chief has had long talk with the city attorney and the latter says there is a way whereby the dealers guilty of the practise emplained of can be dealt with.

"I am keeping up the investigation, said Chief Barlow, "There is plenty of w to deal with them and I propose o push the investigation to the limit and put a stop to the business of de-ratiding people."
