She came along with the wind abeam till she crossed the bow of the lightship close ahead, then quartering away her spinnaker was sheeted exactly on the line and the third day's battle was begun. The official time of the start was: Mayfourer 11:22:40, the Galatea 11:24:10. With a 20 mile ron before them there was an excellent opportunity to test their speed in a steady breeze and with very little sea to impede their progress.
