Peabody School Bill, &c.

WASHINGTON, 10.—The chair

called for the business on the calendar,

and the committee on public

buildings being entitled to the

floor, the bill of that committee

was called up and disposed of.

The bill to grant a site for the

Peabody school at San Augustine,

Fla., came up, the pending ques-

tion being on the amendment sub-

mitted last session, providing that

if at any time a distinction shall be

made among the pupils on account

of color, the school shall be

closed, and the school board shall

be fined \$500. The amendment was

rejected, yeas 23, nays 24. Cameron,

Ferry, of Conn., Gilbert, Morrill,

of Vermont, and others, sprang up

among the negatives. A motion

of Miss, said the vote indicated

that the republicans had become

thoroughly imbued with the spirit

of civil rights, and the would

vote against them. The vote just

taken could be construed in no

other way than that the republicans

might, if they chose, exclude col-

ored children. Morrill denied that

such a construction was justified.

The bill passed without division,

Alcorn voting in the negative.

Howe entered a motion to recon-

sider the vote passing the bill.
