State Health Board Reports Conditions in Twenty Counties.

The Utah state board of health has lust issued its May bulletin, containing report of contagious and infectious diseases in the state for the current month, received from, 75 local health officers in 20 counties, 20 of whom reported their communities free from all of the diseases required to be reported.
