SPANISH GUNBOATS SEIZED.

NEW YORK.

The Spanish gunboats seized.—Blatchford indicted.—Eric Directors suspended.—Action of law against them. The gunboats libelled.—The Boylston Bank robbery.

NEW YORK.—The Spanish gunboats have been seized and are now in custody. The United States authorities are awaiting the action of the courts.

The Grand Jury in the United States District Court has found an indictment against Blatchford for complicity in the drawback frauds; also against the Caldwell express.

At a court held at Delhi, Ohio, Delaware county, an order was granted by the court, suspending Jay Gould, James Fisk, Jr., Fred K. A. Lane, Abram Gould, Leo. Hall, M. Smith and Chas. G. Dowson, Directors of the Erie Railroad Company.

An action has been commenced by Joseph H. Ramsey, a well-known citizen of Albany, on behalf of the stockholders and bondholders of the Erie Railroad. The plaintiff computes that the monies reserved by the defendants is no less than forty-one millions, six hundred and ninety-three thousand.

A Washington special says it is generally believed that the Spanish gunboats will be released. The Peruvian Minister is, apparently, taking no steps to sustain the charges that they are intended to be used against Peru.

ST. LOUIS.

A Steamboat on Fire. St. Louis.—Captain Blake, of the steamer Babcock, gives some particulars of the accident to his boat on Sunday. The fire was discovered in the pilot house, which with the upper part of the deck was furiously ablaze.

CARDINGTON.

Cardington, Ohio.—S. F. McQuiddy, a citizen of Cardington, killed his son today, by shooting him through the head; a family difficulty is the alleged cause of this act.

BUFFALO.

Accidentally Shot. Buffalo.—Claude Brim, book-keeper of the Union Iron works was accidentally shot by a friend, while target shooting yesterday.

OTTAWA.

Volunteers to Suppress Revolt. Ottawa.—The Military Department has received offers from the commanders of the volunteer forces at Toronto, Montreal and elsewhere to serve in any expedition organized to suppress the revolt at Red River.

FOREIGN NEWS.

PARIS.

Genoa and the Spanish Throne. Paris.—Private advices received here, contradict, positively, the general impression that Italy favors the election of the Duke of Genoa to the Spanish throne.

BOSTON.

The Boylston Bank Robbery. Boston.—By the robbery of the Boylston Bank many persons have lost all their property. There is no clue to the thieves yet.

WASHINGTON.

Officers relieved.—International exhibition. Washington.—Captain C. H. Carlton has been relieved from duty as Professor of Military Science in the Marine University, and has been ordered to report to the Commanding General of the Department of the Platte.

CUBAN.

The Insurgents Losing Ground. Washington.—The latest reliable information from Cuba, concerning the

insurgents, shows a decline of their cause; they are not in possession of a single town, having been obliged to abandon everything, even Guaymas the seat of Céspedes' government.

CHICAGO. More about the suit against the Erie Directors—Peru careless about the gunboats. CHICAGO, 25.—A New York special says that the injunctions that have been issued by Judge Murray of the Supreme Court, against Gould, Fisk and others, of the Erie Railroad, has caused much comment among financiers generally.

Vote of thanks to De Lesseps. The Cortes has passed a vote of thanks to De Lesseps, the President and Director of the Suez Canal.

MEMPHIS.

Raiders and Negroes Killed. MEMPHIS, 24.—A terrible affray occurred at New Tiptonville, on Monday. A party of masked men went to the house of a Mr. Jones, planter, for the purpose of disarming the Negroes working for him; Jones, having an intimation of this, determined to resist, as the Negroes had been peaceable and well disposed.

MADRID.

Reforms in Porto Rico. MADRID.—The Minister of the Colonies, to-day received advices, from Porto Rico, saying that the Governor forbids the discussion of any proposition for a separation from Spain. He proclaims complete religious liberty and gives the right of suffrage to all who can read well, except slaves.
