NO MAN STRONGER THAN HIS STOMACH

GRAND CIRCUIT COMES IN.

New York, Feb. 15.—The Herald today says:

Following close upon the heels of the biennial congress of the National Trotting association the stewards of the grand circuit held a meeting at the Hoffman House today. The fact that it had been called so soon after the adjournment of the congress which ousted, as it had been said, from the board of review four of the stewards of the grand circuit, besides re-organizing the demands of that organization for racing stewards of its own selection, led to the belief in some quarters that the big circuit might break away from the national association and either join the Amateur or come out as an independent body on the lines of the Jockey club. No such action was taken. The grand circuit accepted the situation and decided to avail itself of the provisions of the new rules relating to the selection of racing stewards. The men who thus strove to avoid the provisions of the incorporated grand circuit were C. K. G. Billings and James Butler, both of whom were on the board of review until Wednesday's congress; J. J. Campau, and H. K. Devereaux. Acting under the new rules, the board of review today elected each member of a regular circuit to recommend not less than two and not more than five names to be considered as racing stewards of the circuit, the conference yesterday agreed that each track should name five instead of only two men for the position. The names of the men should name the same five. The men agreed upon were Senator Horace White, Col. W. W. Johnson, J. M. Johnson, J. M. Johnson, president of the New England Circuit, and J. M.
