Dr. Angel Tells Michigan Seniors To Appear to be What They Really Are.

BE GENUINE AND SINCERE.

Have Positive Plans and Purpose of Growth, Then Stick to Them— Cherish Noble Ideals.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 5.—"Be genuine and sincere; genius is not necessary to give us a good influence over others," said the venerable Dr. James B. Angell, president of the University of Michigan yesterday addressing the 900 members of the class of 1909. The graduation of this class in June will be coincident with Dr. Angell's retirement from the university presidency which he has held since 1871.

The occasion of the address was the annual "sawing out" when the seniors don their caps and gowns for the first time and after a parade on the campus, assemble in University hall, to listen to the farewell address of the university president.

"In the long run your neighbors will take you at your true value," said President Angell. "To appear to be what we really are is consistent both with modesty and self-respect."

"One must be brave in meeting every duty. When called to promote the rights of others, men they respect of others if they don't meet them. Men admire pluck and are moved by it, but to have force, it is not necessary to be over-demonstrative or spectacular."

"Have some positive plans and purpose of growth and stick to them. Cherish your noble ideals. Try to live up to the best thoughts that come to you in your best moments. Even if some of you fall below them, regain them again. For if you are hospitable to their visitations they will never lose altogether their lifting and inspiring powers."

PERSIAN RULER, WHO FACES REVOLUTION; RUSSIAN INVADERS; SCENE AT TEHERAN



Russian troops entered Persia with the consent of Great Britain and relieved the beleaguered city of Tabriz, which for months had been held by Persian Nationalists, who are demanding the establishment of constitutional government. The Tabriz section has been torn by disorder for many weeks, and all Persia is threatened with a revolution such as has just reformed Turkey. On the day that the Russians reached Tabriz the shah's troops and those of the Nationalists clashed only a few miles from Teheran, and the Imperialists were signally defeated. The Nationalists are on the point of attacking the capital, and other battles are expected. The shah has summarily dismissed his minister of foreign affairs, Said ed Dowleh, for his constitutional leanings.

SOBBING AND SHRIEKING NEVER HELP ANYBODY

Chicago, May 5.—Rev. Charles J. Little, president of the Garrett Biblical Institute, delivered the commencement address to the 54 graduates of the Chicago Training school and told them their task is not mere play and requires the best efforts of intelligent women. The abolition of poverty and disease, he declared, is the great work of the twentieth century.

"No amount of sobbing and shrieking ever helps anybody," said Dr. Little, "and much that is in print in this age is merely that, but there is no intelligence in it. In no age has there been such a demand upon women generally as in this age, and in no other age has there been such sensitiveness to the woes of the race."

A SENSATIONAL SHOOTING.

As Result Robert Barrows is Dead, Mrs. Barrows Held as Witness.

Detroit, May 5.—Robert Barrows, a painter, is dead. Michael Burkhart, under arrest charged with murder, and Mrs. Barrows is under detention as a witness, as a result of a sensational shooting which occurred last night in the rear of 143 Lafayette avenue. Mrs. Barrows was employed as housekeeper. The husband and wife had been separated for some time.

Last night Mrs. Barrows was standing on the back porch talking to Burkhart, a motorman, who had driven up in an automobile, when her husband appeared. Only a few words were spoken when a revolver flashed, Barrows dropped to the ground and Burkhart disappeared. Burkhart, when arrested at his home later in the night, admitted, according to the police, that he had shot Barrows.

FIRE AT OREGON PENITENTIARY

Salem, Ore., May 5.—The foundry, molding room and polishing room buildings of the Northwest State works at the Oregon state penitentiary were completely destroyed by fire last night, causing damage to the amount of \$30,000. The flames were carried through the buildings along greasy shafting and were well under headway when discovered. The burned buildings are located 100 feet from the main structure. At the first alarm all the force of prison guards was placed around the building and the trustees released. As the flames advanced it became apparent that the main structure was in great danger unless explosions occurred from the gasoline tanks and the prisoners were kept in their cells though under heavy guard.
