Cruisers Reach Vladivostok.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 18, 11:10 a. m.-It is learned from official sources by the Associated Press that the cruisers Gromoboi and Rossia have reached Vladivostok after the battle with Ad-miral Uriu's squadron off Tsu Island. Both ships were considerably damaged. In addition to the loss of the cruiser Rurik, two officers were killed. There is no confirmation of the re-port that the cruisers Pallada and Diana have reached Vladivostok, and the

admiralty had no news this morning bearing on the whereabouts of the other vessels of the late Rear Admiral Withoeft's squadron.
