GOLD EXPECTED

DEGOLD IMPORTS

Believed Great Assistance in Relieving Financial Stringency Will Be Had.

SUSPENDED BANKS TO REOPEN

Imperial Bank of Germany Raises Rate of Discount, Causing Some Depression.

Particularly in London—Due to Anticipated Demand for Gold By New York.

New York, Oct. 29.—Great assistance in relieving the financial stringency is expected to result from the large shipments of gold to import made yesterday and from the further large shipments which it is believed will be made within the next few days. The movement of American crops to European markets, together with the removal of a demand for copper abroad, will give the United States large credits with foreign bankers, and these can be availed of in bringing in gold, it is believed to the fullest extent that may be necessary.

It was announced today that several of the banks which were compelled to suspend last week have about perfected their plans to re-open for business. President Montgomery of the Hamilton bank, a Harlem institution which closed last week said today: "This bank will resume business on Monday next in any event. I understood also, that the Twelfth Ward bank will resume in a few days."

The rate on the Trust Company of America and the Lincoln Trust company continued today but in diminished volume.

The announcement of the increase of the rate of discount by the Imperial bank of Germany from 5 1/2 to 6 1/2 per cent was of somewhat unfavorable effect on the London stock market as the London rate of discount is a barometer of credit at present for speculative purposes.

Notwithstanding this, however, American securities were in demand. The only noteworthy weak feature in London was Canadian Pacific which declined 1/4. Amalgamated Copper advanced 1/4. Anaconda, 1/4. Alchib, 1/4. Steel, 1/4. The Chicago market was unchanged. U. S. Steel common was 1/4 lower and United States Steel 1/4 higher.

Operations were much restricted when business began at the stock exchange today but the tone was irregular and unevenly in different parts of the list.

The market became quite weak in the course of the first hour owing to the advance of a 5 1/2 per cent in Canadian Pacific, which was evidence of forced liquidation. 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WESTERN FINANCIAL CONDITION SATISFACTORY

Chicago, Oct. 29.—The financial condition throughout the west was today satisfactory in general to the bankers and to the majority of business interests. In all the money centers today the checks and certificate plan was used and the banks were holding as closely as possible to their issues of currency. The banks in Kansas reported themselves in a strong position, many of them having fully 50 per cent in excess of the ordinary reserve. Out of 400,000 savings depositors in Chicago only 1,500 made application for withdrawal of their accounts, or gave notice of desire to withdraw. The clearing house issued to its members \$3,000,000 in certificates. The debit balances which had to be settled with the certificates were far smaller than usual, amounting barely \$1,500,000. John J. Mitchell, president of the Illinois Trust and Savings bank, which has the largest number of savings accounts in the city said today: "We are pleased and satisfied over the turn affairs took yesterday. This bank received notices from 800 depositors to withdraw their money, but only 1,500 actually did so. As a result, we received a sum for in excess of the amount for which withdrawal orders were received. Under the circumstances, we think the situation is surprisingly strong."

The day opened quietly at the Illinois Savings bank which yesterday had been the scene of excitement in the banking situation. A few depositors were at the door when the bank opened, but a number of them went away without withdrawing their money. The day was quiet at the other banks in the city which had savings accounts business appeared to be on an adequately normal basis, there being no more people around the banks than at all other national banks. The officers reported that the check and certificate system had worked in a satisfactory manner and no trouble of the kind was anticipated. Throughout the day generally, it was reported that the financial condition is sound and that there is no danger of a run upon a bank anywhere.

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EDITOR HARDEN DULY ACQUITTED

Count Von Moltke Loses His Libel Suit and Condemned To Pay Costs.

Count Von Moltke, the German military leader, was today acquitted in a libel suit brought against him by Count Kuno von Moltke, formerly military governor of Berlin, for defamation of character. In addition, Count Moltke was condemned to bear the costs of the trial.

TRIAL HAS POLITICAL EFFECT.

Socialist Papers Are Attacking Monarchical Principle—All Newspapers Printed Full Accounts.

Berlin, Oct. 29.—Maximilian Harden, editor of Die Zukunft, was acquitted today in the suit brought against him by Count Kuno von Moltke, formerly military governor of Berlin, for defamation of character. In addition, Count Moltke was condemned to bear the costs of the trial.

The trial, which began Oct. 23, attracted the greatest interest throughout Germany. Counsel for Harden charged that the court clique of which Count Moltke was a member, was guilty of infamous practices and also had sought to exert undue influence over Emperor Wilhelm.

The names of Prince Philip zu Eulenburg, ex-German ambassador to Vienna and Lieut.-Gen. von Hofmann, one of the emperor's adjutants, were mentioned by Harden as being members of the clique, referred to as the "round table," and an army officer who had served at Potsdam, testified to having taken part in orgies at the house of Maj. Count Lynar, which had resulted in the dismissal from the service in disgrace of Count and Lieut.-Gen. von Hofmann.

Von Moltke denied that such a clique as the "round table" could exist and also denied the other charges made against him. Harden, on the other hand, insisted that he had written to withdraw anything he had written on the subject, but said he did not accuse Von Moltke of crime.

Justice Koenig, the presiding judge, today made the verdict as easy for Von Moltke as was consistent with the conclusion arrived at. He said Harden was justified in what he had written, but there was no evidence that Von Moltke had at any time acted upon abnormal inclinations or that he knew what took place at Maj. Count Lynar's villa or of Lieut.-Gen. Hofmann's behavior.

Harden, when the verdict was announced, was cheered by the spectators present in court and by the thousands of people waiting in the rain outside. Von Moltke heard the verdict with impassiveness.

The trial is already having considerable political effect. The socialist daily newspapers are attacking the monarchical principle with studied rage, mocking, sneering, and assailing the exalted conditions which have been described as "fourishing in the hot house atmosphere of the court" where the sovereign is surrounded by a clique of courtiers and companions and counselors and corruption of whose private lives taints their judgment on home and foreign questions.

The newspapers, regardless of party affiliations, printed full accounts of the proceedings and some of the most sensational papers, like the Frankfurt Zeitung, affirm that it is evident that in the Moroccan controversy with France, Germany followed two policies, that of the emperor and that of the sovereign. The latter being attributed to Prince zu Eulenburg's influence working independently of his majesty's constitutional advisers.

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THE PENNSYLVANIA WILL NOT LAY MEN OFF.

Philadelphia, Oct. 29.—Rumors that the Pennsylvania Railroad will lay off between 20,000 and 30,000 men were today denied by high officials of the company. The following statement was given out at the company's office:

"There is no truth in the statement that 20,000 men were to be discharged by the Pennsylvania Railroad company. Nothing of the kind has even been discussed. In view of the fact that the traffic for October is 11 per cent greater than for the same month last year, which would make the movement for the month the largest in the history of the company, any material reduction in the forces would not be practicable."

RIOT IN CHICAGO.

Five Hundred Italians Took Part, One Man Fatally Shot.

Chicago, Oct. 29.—One man was shot and fatally wounded, several others were hurt and battered and 12 men were arrested during a riot today at Halsted and Taylor streets, in which 500 Italians took part.

A fight started between Charles Speidino and Angelo Caporaso, two men whom a crowd had gathered around. Speidino was shot twice and died. The friends of both men joined in the melee and in a short time a free-for-all fight was in progress.

The street car lines were blocked and interrupted and it required 20 policemen to restore order.

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BIG GAS BLOWOUT AT PAVETTE, IDA.

Second Occurs at the Oil Well Now Being Driven by Prospectors.

Water Shoots Up 200 Feet. Large Rocks Hurtled Into the Air With Great Force—Expect to Tap Oil Lake.

Pavette, Idaho, Oct. 29.—Another gas blowout, being the second to occur from the oil well being drilled here by the Oregon Oil & Gas company, occurred this morning about 10 o'clock and there is now enough in the well to supply gas to every house in the city. It will be piped to the city as soon as the company can accomplish the work.

The blowout was similar to the first one which occurred Oct. 15, only it was much stronger, and as the tools were out of the well, it did not plug up. Water and oil were blown into the air more than 200 feet. The rocks were hurtled into the air with great force. After about 20 minutes the force began to subside and a plug was driven in the top of the well which now holds the roaring gas beneath it.

Another well will be sunk as soon as possible, with the intention of giving considerably deeper than the first well, which is 725 feet deep, and it is expected that a lake of oil will be tapped.
