Elder Danham, of Bryant's Pond, Maine, is famous for his horticultural triumphs. His latest, and perhaps most notable achievement is in the department of squashes. In 1866 he raised a squash that weighed about 195 pounds; the next year the same seed produced one of 186 pounds. This year he has a dozen on his vines of various degrees of enormity. The vine was transplanted June 10th, the first squash appeared July 15th; July 28th it measured four feet in circumference. August 7th it measured six feet in circumference, showing a growth of twenty-four inches in ten days, or more than two inches per day. This squash he calls "The Champion of Maine." It was produced by a cross of the "French Mammoth Golden Ball" with the "West India Golden Russet."
