Pleasant Bathing in the Dead Sea.

Reaching at last this most remarkable of all the seas and lakes of our globe, we prepared to take a bath—and such a bath I can hardly expect ever to take again. I had previously bathed in numerous seas, lakes, and rivers, but never did I enjoy such a bath as this. The specific gravity of the water is such from its holding in solution so large a proportion of salt (261 per cent.), that one floats upon its surface like a cork. At the time there was only a gentle ripple upon the sea, and being a good swimmer I at once struck out into deep water, I soon found that I could not only swim and float with wonderful ease, but that I could actually walk in the water, sinking only to the arm-pits. Discovering this fact I made for the shore, and taking Dr. C., one of our party, who could not swim, by the hand, led him into the sea where the water was many fathoms deep. At first he was quite reluctant to follow me, but he soon gained confidence on finding there was no danger of sinking, and he enjoyed the novel bath as much as if he had been an expert swimmer. Should the bather allow the water to get into his eyes or mouth he would suffer considerable abatement in his enjoyment an on account of its extremely salt, SILKY & REVOLVING HAY RAKES, bitter and irritating nature. No fish can live in this sea, but various kinds of ducks abound here at certain seasons of the year. HOW DONALDSON INTENDS CROS-ING THE ATLANTIC IN HIS BAL-SING THE ATLANTIC IN HIS BAL-LOON .- An American balloonist, by name Mr Donaldson, has informed the Societe d Aerostation of Paris, that within three or four months he intends crossing the Atlantic, from the United States to Europe, in a balloon measuring seventy thousand cubic meters. Mr. Donaldson is convinced that there exists a constant current of air in the upper strata of the terrestrial atmosphere setting at that season from west to east. He is undeterred by previous failures, and has provided himself with cans of Liebig's meat extract, life-belts, blue lights and rockets, carrier pigeons, bottles to contain floating messages, astronomical instruments and flags, by means of which he can signal to vessels near which he may pass. He will probably travel alone for the sake of lightness, and the ballast in the balloon car will principally consist of 'fire pots' of Mr. Donaldson's own invention, which are said to be in tin cylinders containing a chemical substance which becomes inflammable instar taneously upon contact with water, emits a brilliant and long-lasting flame. As Mr. Donaldson is borne rapidly along eastward he will drop these fire pots into the sea every ten minutes, so at night the whole horizon, he expects, will be illuminated, and he will leave a fiery track behind him on the Atlantic. The scheme sounds all the more a "big" one, as the recent voyage of the "Zenith" balloon, from Paris to the neighborhood of Bordeaux, is the longest on record, and only occupied some sixteen hours. The balloonist Green, in all his fourteen voyages, was never longer in the air than three or four hours at a time. Sixteen years ago the 'Geant' balloon went up from the Champ de Mars, and descended in Hanover, after six hours' sailing. Subsequently MM. Flammarion and Goddard traveled from Paris to Prussia in eleven hours. Several similar trips have since been made. However, Mr. Donaldson hopes to Harrow Teeth, Etc. be in the air "not longer than a week."-Pall Mall Gazette.
