Small Pox in Montreal.

MONTREAL, 20. - Thirty-two new cases of small pox were reported here to-day. Some of the effected persons reside in the principal west end streets. One case was reported in the lodge of Ravenscraig, the residence of the late Hugh Allen. The theaters have all been closed. Disinfectants are to be used in the watering of the streets. satisfactory to the Saints.
