

The inspection of the U. S. district attorney.

Manager Brown of the Western Union telegraph obeyed the order by handing over the telegrams to Deputy Clerk Johnson.

The trial of James A. Reid, an accused assassin to murder Charles A. McDaniel, was taken up this afternoon. Reid is the man arrested for shooting Blumine on Nov. 1, in an attempt to assassinate him.

The wounded and half-paralyzed McDaniel, who was shot through the street after dark, and was ordered to throw his hands up by a highwayman. Failing to do so, his assailant shot at him, the bullet entering the left cheek and cutting out a portion of the bone.

The wounded man was laid up, and Reid was arrested for having performed such acts.

On a former occasion, the court appointed C. V. Morse and Morris Shumway to defend Reid. Today H. M. Murphy was appointed to defend him.

The latter has some cases that were necessary to be heard. The defendant claims that he is the wrong man, and says he was not near the place where the crime was committed at the time. The former gave to Thompson for district judge 1,143 votes as against 1,072 for Reid as being the man who made the assault.

Reid testified that he was in the Grand Opera House the evening the shooting occurred, and that he had been to the Salt Lake City printing office, worked on the city and county records, and on Capitol hill, and in the Western gambling hall. Last Saturday he was arrested in this city on a charge of highway robbery, and was held over every four hours to have town, and returned Oct. 31, the day before Michael was assassinated.
